

Racers' Breakfast









The Start box- Push the horn button at the 10 minute to start. 10 seconds before the 5 minute start push the start button. It will give you a series of beeps telling you that something is about to happen, follow the directions as to what flags to put up and down at those tones. There is a sheet with the box explaining which flags are used and what to do with each of them.

Over Early- There will be a flag and a sound. The Race Committee will try to hail the boat at fault. The R.C. monitors ch 9.

We will try to keep track of the best corrected time each week with an overall winner announced at the end of the year.

Dingy Racing- Jonathan Smith will try to organize a dingy racing schedule this year

Protest Committee- The protest committee is still forming, but at the moment will be comprised of Rob Doiron, Alan Prettyman, George Mooney.

Stories by George



ince I have taken the liberty of telling sailing stories of many of you in this club, maybe it is time to tell the story of the sinking of my Classic 22 (also know as a Viking 22).

A Viking 22 is a sweet looking daysailer with a small cuddy and two small berths up forward. It has a huge cockpit with floatation tanks along each side disguised as seats. The boat is open from the cockpit all the way forward, no bulkheads. This is an important part of the story.

Now to the story.....

Dale Souilliere and yours truly are sailing along in a spanking breeze over in the area that we use for starting our club races. Things are perfect!!! Then, a hard squall hammers us from under an innocent looking sky. We luff up to get the sails down and instantly get hit with a 90 degree wind shift. Lots of air! The Viking heels under the onslaught until the coaming is under water. We take on torrents of water as the wind pins us in a full knockdown.

Exciting!! Too much air to get the sails off, no steerage. We're settling rapidly but don't have too much concern because the cockpit is full of flotation and there's flotation up forward as well. Then Dale asks "What the bloody #!? is that whistling sound?". The squall has abated so it's not the sound of the wind. No question we're not settling anymore...... we're sinking!!!!!!

The sound we hear is the air rushing out of the floatation tanks. Sounds almost like a jet engine. Slowly the boat sinks until Dale and I, sitting on the side deck, are getting our bums wet. Now she noses down until the bow hits the bottom--- the transom on which we are now standing is just awash. From shore this scene would have a distinctly religious flavour. Two very wet intrepid sailors apparently standing ON the water carrying on a very animated conversation.

We put a line on a life jacket and tie it to the backstay so if she drifts we'll at least be able to keep track of the boat.

This is the part that even now is very difficult for me to admit to all of you........... we are rescued by a POWERBOAT!

We were dropped off at Ralph and Molly's. Immediately a crew jumps into one of the tin boats and out they go to survey the damage. They report back in about half an hour - No sign of the boat - a fisherman did report to them seeing a boat stop and pick up a lifejacket (our lifejacket) after much effort. Can you believe it?

Some of the guys lead by Ralph went back out and after substantial effort managed to snag my sunken boat by dragging an anchor, by this time it had drifted down to the bifurcation mark.

Next day, one of Bob Ferguson's brother's brought his diving equipment and went out and dove

down and attached a tow line under the bow of the boat. Now we turn to the (here comes that word again) POWERBOATS for assistance.

Louis Mayrand and Rolly Gignac were neighbours of Ralph and Molly, how great is that? Because they both owned good, strong powerboats in the 30 foot range. According to the amateur marine engineers in our club, if we could get one of the powerboats to start towing my sunken boat it would rise to the surface as it moved through the water. So, we tried it. Problem. When Louis' boat tried to pull the considerable weight of a Viking 22 full of water, it caused the towing boat to crab sideways. So, Rolly took a line from the tow boat at right angles and pulled hard enough to keep the towing boat on a straight course. Beautiful!

Once this strange ensemble started to move up river the sailboat actually began to surface. What a sight!!! Two powerboats inching up the river and then 100 feet astern the top of a mast breaks the surface......looks like a periscope......then the spreaders streaming with seaweed. Slowly she surfaced, sails flapping, weed enshrouded to the cheers of the accompanying flotilla of the LMYC gang.

As she was towed up the river to the home canal, she porpoised two or three times sinking to the spreaders, then rising triumphant to the surface again. We can't turn this towing group into the canal so the poor Viking is allowed to sink in the main channel in front of the canal.

At this point, the tow line was passed ashore to the LaSalle Mariners who then hand over hand pulled the Viking up the channel bank and on to the shore. There it was simple to bail her out. What a performance! Yeah LMYC!


PS. The Viking was resurrected and bought by Bob Williams to be sailed into all kinds of mis-adventures!

Abbott Party






Adria came into this world at Metropolitan Hospital 3 weeks early weighing 7 lbs 8 oz with a height of 20.5 inches.











c. Purchase of water weed cutting equipment:

As approved under the Budget we have now purchased the following equipment to help keep our water weeds under control:

<u>Jenson Lake Mower</u> at a cost of \$ 3,835.66 including exchange, GST, PST, shipping and brokerage fees. There is a one year warranty on this but the warranty period does not start until July 1st.

<u>Eliminator 1200 Powerbox</u> at a cost of \$ 229.99 including GST and PST. This is a rechargeable powerbox that will be used to power the Jenson Lake Mower. It can also be used as an emergency power source around the Club and for starting Boat Motors at launch time.

An Aquatic Weed Eradicator at a cost of \$ 160.08 including GST, PST and shipping. This is a reinforced 28 inch serrated cutting blade on a 2 piece 11 foot handle for removing weeds that are close to the boats.

A Surface Lake Rake at a cost of \$ 160.08 including GST, PST and shipping. This is a 36 inch wide aluminum rake with a detachable styrene float and a 2 piece 11 foot handle for raking out the weeds that have been cut loose.

The total cost of these items was \$ 4,385.81. To cut and clear the weeds takes 2 power boats with a crew of 3 in each boat. I have been assured by the Sea Cadets that we can continue to use their boats for this job. So for future years our only cost to clear the weeds from our harbours should be whatever gas we use.

All of these items are now stored in the garage.

The Vice Commodore is looking for a member to coordinate the removal of harbour weeds and to take on the task of overseeing and maintaining the new equipment.

d. Accounts Payable Status.

Call on Dennis Pare to give the current status of the Accounts Payable problem.

As of now Nick Maroukis and Dick Benning are the only 2 left with outstanding balances. Dick Benning is being put into collection. Nick Marikous as of March 24, 06 will be taking care of his account in order to not be put into collection.

5. OFFICERS REPORTS:

- a. Commodore (Rick Beresford)
 - I propose that we set aside a Sunday in June or July to have a member's Fun Race. This will be a Club sponsored race where all members will be encouraged to participate whether or not they are usually racers. When I was on the West Coast last year I read about a Sail Club in Seattle that set up a Commodore's Race where all members could participate in a Sail Day and I would like our Club to consider doing something similar here. For our race the course could be from our usual Monday/Wednesday Start line to DF1 and finishing at the Widow's Walk. Another suggestion is for a start at the north end of Grassy Island proceeding down river to the Bifarcation mark and finishing at the Widow's Walk, The Race would be in 3 PHRF fleets and a JOG fleet. There could be 3 Prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place - for example a bottle of rum and or bottles of wine. To be eligible for a prize a boat would only be required to complete the course the actual amount of time it takes to complete the course will not be a consideration. Also the boat's actual finishing position in its' fleet will not be a consideration in awarding prizes. The prizes will be determined by a draw of all boat names that complete the course. The Club will provide Pizza following the Race for all participants and members will provide their own refreshments. I think that this could be a great family day that can be enjoyed by all members. Possible dates to consider are June 25, July 2 or July 9.

- a. Harbour Master (Bob MacKenzie); The dock plan is up. You must have current insurance to Red in order to be launched. You must set up your launch with the launch crews, Carl will only be doing launches in the mornings during the week.
- b. Roads and Grounds (Gus Martin); Gus moves to complete the grading and leveling of the road up to the pump out building, \$2,775.00. Seconded by Patrick Holland. Carried. Gus moves to remove both burms and level the low areas by the creek, \$1,200 to \$1,500. Seconded by Patrick Holland. Carried. The garden at the front of the club has a water valve in it that the city of LaSalle has to conduct work on. We will have to move the garden to allow them to do their work. The bushes that are worth saving will have to be pulled and replanted until the work is complete.
 - c. Maintenance (Lothar Bauer); All of the equipment will be in service.

7. New Business:

Club House Changes – proposal by Bob Reaume.

It will cost us \$10,000 to \$15,000 to close in the area under the north porch to give us a private room. A lively debate followed this announcement leading to Ted Popel proposing that a planning committee be formed to look into the possibility of the expansion, costs, etc. of a project like this. Volunteers are needed to sit on this committee. John Amyot, John Amyot Jr, Ted Popel, Rob Dorion, Gus Martin, Alan Prettyman, Dave Evans have all agreed to sit on this committee.

The cost for any Club House changes other than the kitchen counter and sink is not in the approved Budget. If the project is approved the cost will have to come out of the Line of Credit as a special expenditure outside of the Budget. We would in effect have a negative Budget for the year.
