

Now, we need to move forward with the business of **our** club. There are challenges to be faced, but together all of us can cooperate and make this a better place.


My promise to you is that I will deal with the membership and with the issues we have with honesty, integrity, openness and good humour.

Lake Levels Raise Boaters' Spirit Windsor Star March 7, 2005 By Craig Person

This year's wet and snowy winter has boosted the levels of Lake Ontario and Lake St. Clair which have been lower than average in recent in years - making both spring flooding and happy boaters more likely.



"Most people would like to see water levels trending upward, though getting them up significantly means a lot of rain," Chuck Southam, Environment Canada water resources engineer, said Friday "Most boaters have had a rough time the last couple of years with levels well below average.

"But we're looking a little better heading into this summer"

According to the most recent monthly measurements taken March 2, and posted Friday on the Environment Canada website, lake levels bumped up notably in January

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers says Great Lakes water levels had recently plummeted to their lowest levels in three decades. While officials on both sides of the border offer a range of predictions, even conservative estimates suggest higher water levels than the last few years.

The Windsor area has endured near-record levels of snow this winter, along with rain. If March continues that trend, spring levels will climb even higher

"I feel more comfortable myself going anywhere when I know I've got higher levels than my charts show," said Gary Cobs, past commodore of the Sun Parlour Boat Club.

"Everybody benefits (on water) when the lake levels go up because you can go places you couldn't go before," said Capt. Darryl Clow of the Canadian Coast Guard ship the Samuel Risley

"We haven't been to Amherstburg, our home base, in several years because of the lower lake levels.

"With the commercial vessels, for every inch of water and they really do watch inches - they can load another inch of cargo and that translates into additional freight rates."

New Launch Requirements



- 1. Show up on time for appointments. If you don't the launch/haulout will be rescheduled at the convenience of the launch crew.
- 2. The owner must provide two able-bodied people to handle slings.
- 3. No boat will be launched unless it has been marked on the port side to show where slings go.
- 4. Cradles should be marked to show where rear of keel goes.
- 5. No boat will be hauled unless proper blocks (not concrete) are attached to cradle for pickup by trailer.
- 6. Boat owner is responsible for the cleanup of winter storage site for his/her boat.





Did You Know?



Did you know that Bob Bingham was responsible for constructing the sign at Point Pelee National Park? The arches were constructed in the early 60's when Bob was employed at Faucher Lumber in Amherstburg. Bob described the process for the construction of the entrance arches.

The forms were made up and then a few layers of wood were laminated together and were held in place every night in a large press. After completion many coats of some type of clear finish was applied and then as Bob recollects were installed during the winter months.

The company Bob worked for originally constructed doors and windows and prior to his leaving were construction oak picture frames for Master Craft, paint by number kits for delivery to locations in Stratford Ontario & Toledo Ohio.

The company has since closed and the owner retired and living along River Canard near the entrance to \Ranta Marina.


Greetings came from near and far; one of which was from Barb and Manfred on their yearly sojourn enjoying sunsets and sailing.


Mary and Dave Nantais (Social Director) Preparing Breakfast At LMYC


This year as in previous years the Sea Cadets under the direction of Rick Beresford Vice-Commodore and Commodore John Metcalfe assisted in the awesome event.
