


Another short article this month. I want to thank all the members who attended the Blessing of the Fleet. We had good participation and once again John and Louise Geary did an excellent job in organizing this event.

Regatta time time is fast approaching. If anyone needs work hours please check the work board or see Bob Bingham.


One project which needs attention is to paint and repair the life ring on the wall in the south harbour.



The person I spoke with also indicated that there was no charge for registering the CLUB as a Co-operative Member Organisation.

BOAT/U.S. is to mail details to LMYC in the near future. This may be timely as some people have indicated to me that most BOAT/U.S. memberships come due about this time of the year.

In the mean time, I have been given a Cooperative Member Organization number which can be used by all members of LMYC when applying for BOAT/U.S. membership. Should you wish to apply for membership, please quote Co-operative Member Organisation number GACN 0084. The current fee for Canadian members is \$30.00 U.S.

If anyone has a problem getting a membership using this number, please advise me and I can contact BOAT/U.S. head office for further clarification.



Vermilion provides a perfect setting for a family outing with its location along the shores of Lake Erie, the picturesque Vermilion River and historical "Harbour Town 1837". Take a stroll through its historical district, browse through its many shops and stores or spend some time at the famed Inland Seas Maritime Museum where the history and excitement of the lakes will unfold before you. If you get hungry you'll have no difficulty choosing from its many fine restaurants.

Dockage is available at a number of location in Vermilion. The city docks are the first set of finger docks you will see on the starboard side when they enter the Vermilion River. The docks are located near the city's red brick water plant which is just off Main Street. The city docks provide drinking water, and electricity as well as public restrooms with showers. It is suggested reservation be made for space. If you are interested call 216-969-0761.


### Just a Reminder

Safety for the children is always top priority in the Club House and surrounding area. Please make sure that your children are supervised and have life jackets when near the docks.




# Pay Attention To The Rules

"Doggie Poop" is to be picked up by the dog's owner upon the dropping. If not: how long can your dog tread water????




### **Blue Cans**











### Horseshoe Pitching

Also Raiph suggests that each member keep the area around their boat clean and safe.





experience. Of the 39 sailboats entered, 37






