### Pelee Island Regatta!



his year as the sailors approached the starting mark for the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Pelee Island Regatta and Cruise were met with pungent and potentially toxic fumes drifting from a fire at a Michigan chemical factory near the Detroit River. Most sailors encountered the fumes (methyl mercaptan) around D8 which is colourless flammable gas used in the production of chicken feed and pharmaceuticals. The Canadian and U.S. coast guards closed the Detroit River to boat traffic from LaSalle to Amherstburg for five hours. The safety precaution held up four lake freighters and hundreds of smaller vessels.

LMYC racers were very fortunate to make it down the river to the start line just before the river was closed.

There were two starts for this race, Spinnaker and Jog. The race began around 10:00 AM with light North West winds which made the race enjoyable, yet exciting.

Scudder and the adjacent marina were full and LMYC members were treated to a tall ship which docked on the wall.

As the boats arrived club some members took time for a swim on the nearby beaches while others partied and got ready for the evening festivities.

The shuttle arrived at approximately 6:30 to take participants to the winery and dinner was expected at 7:00 PM. Dinner this year

salads and desserts. The meal was excellent.

The awards were presented at 8:30 PM by race chairman John Vandereerden.

After the award presentation LMYC members enjoyed an evening of dancing and general conversation with other members.

### The Tall Ships



ob Ferguson, club member is currently sailing with the tall ships in Lake Huron & Lake Michigan. This is a short summary of his trip so far.

Rob left Sunday on the Tall Ship Cape Rose. He sailed in the <u>Parade of Sails for Detroit 300</u> and then left for 3 weeks to sail in Lake Huron and Lake Michigan

The Cape Rose is a gaff-rigged schooner with a LOA of 52 feet and a sparred length overall of 72 feet. The beam is 16 feet and draft 6 feet 6inches. The rig height is 56 feet with a sail area of 1,284 sq feet. The hull is steel and is powered by a 212 HP diesel.


Her homeport is Wickford, Rhode Island, Narragansett Bay/North Atlantic (summer) and the Florida coast/Caribbean for the winter.


His first stop was Algonac, Michigan where thousands of people lined the shores with welcome banners. Free food and drinks were available to all crew during their stay. There were fifteen other tall ships traveling with them. He then went on to Sarnia and Bay City



There are a lot of antique stores and there are 15 tall ships docked in the small harbour. I feel like royalty, everyone is so friendly. I ended staying up most of the night on the ship."



Mad Max & Rakaia at the finish line


