From the Commodore and Vice-Commodore


Welcome to the Dog Days of Summer

Particular thanks goes out to Molly Allen and the ladies (they know who they are) for a job well done.


Again in times of crisis or tragedy all Mariners are FAMILY.

Visitation was on Saturday and Sunday at Families First Funeral Home & Chapel.



Good News


To date everyone has dockage and dues paid in full. We are presently working with our accountant to prepare for the first time a true financial statement that the club has ever had.

Sue Wagner describes one adventure after another in her new book, The Sailing Adventures of La


Boatique: From Lake Erie to New Zealand. The book contains 288 pages with 32 pages of coloured photographs.


Light air and scorching temperatures prevailed all weekend.






