

At this time of the year, when the roadblocks come up with great regularity, I would like to share a personal experience with my friends about drinking and driving.



John Murphy gets married...








The wedding and reception was held for John and his bride at the LMYC Clubhouse. A good time was had by all, and it seems the guy in the green kilt was having an exceptional time!
