



thanks to Ralph Kepran who spent many hours running off this newsletter. Again THANK YOU.





day, this gave club




November is a month that is a prelude to all the partying of December; so I hope you are all rested up! The merriment of the season is upon us! We kick off the month of December

Haulout 1997


Haulout 1997 was another success thanks to Harbour Master Ralf Fielder, and the LMYC members who assisted with the many jobs. Haulout began early Saturday morning and many members were there even before the crane arrived. The crane arrived before 8:00 am and was busy setting up for the day's work. Members were milling around getting ready for the busy day which was to follow. Members were assigned to different duties and were all busy fulfilling their obligations. Ralf Fielder the Harbour Master was busy lining up the cradles to make the days operation quick and safe. The weather was warm and rain fell occasionally, but never in a





downpour. Yvonne McRobbie was on the job as usual collecting fees from members who were not quite up to date. Bottom washing was an option that many members took. Some members were not happy with the washer's performance. Throughout the day members visited the kitchen of L.M.Y.C for a nutritional break. Everyone worked hard making sure that all the boat were safely in their cradles as the day ended.

Late in the afternoon the 43rd boat came out of the water and one part of LMYC haulout came to a close.



This haulout was not over yet. As the crane left L.M.Y.C. around 5:00 pm it went aground halfway up the road. Other cranes and machinery from other companies came to its rescue but to no avail Around 10:40

pm a man in a Plymouth station wagon, survived a head-on collision with a heavy-duty crane which was parked on Front Road and was taken to the hospital.

The next morning two cranes, and two tow trucks were brought in to rescue the first crane bringing with them 5 loads of stone. During the operation they took apart a portion of the road, built metal platforms, shut of the

hydro and gas. It took all day to prepare to lift the crane.
The first crane which was aground in the club roadway was not removed till Sunday afternoon. An interesting Haulout day.
