




Did You Know



- Rob Dorion Race Director was presented with the Prestigious Flower Pot Award for having the most excuses to not go sailing this year.


Rob Dorion then presented the sailing awards to the skippers and crew. The results are at the end of this article.


The Commodore Bob Ferguson concluded the events and an evening of dancing began with disk jockey Leonora Costa at the controls.

Commodore Bob Ferguson and First Lady Carol Ferguson




