

It is a privilege to again be on the executive at LMYC. I look forward to a successful and rewarding year for our Club and its members.



In conjunction with the newsletter theme, George Mooney and Bob Reaume presented "The Top Ten Things To Do If You Don't Receive Your Newsletter"


