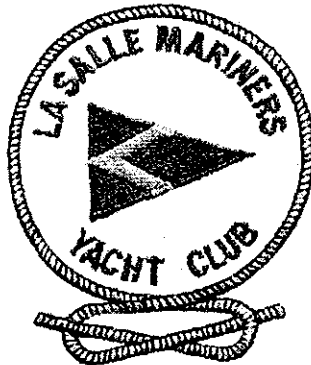

News and Information



LMYC General Meeting

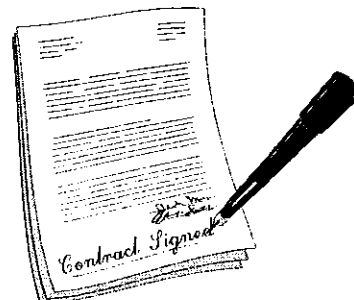


The General Meeting was held on November 21, 2004 beginning at 1:00 PM with Jerry Angus secretary reading the minutes of the last meeting.

The commodore then called for a report from the different committees.

Social Director (Mary Nantais)

- Reported that 112 people attended the Awards Banquet held at Place Concorde. Numbers were down this year from 150 in 2003. Everyone seemed to enjoy the new location and food and will be booking the Awards Banquet there next year.
- Mary spoke of the upcoming events: Tree Trimming on December 11 and Children's Party on December 12. Phil Smith encouraged members and friends attending the Tree Trimming Party to bring an unwrapped children's gift for a needy child. (Frank Chauvin's Holy Name of Mary Food Bank) Phil Smith has been in charge of this worthwhile event for many years. See more information on this event in the newsletter.
- Mary Nantais is also looking for members to be in charge of this year's New Years Eve Party. It could be low key with just a dish to pass.
- Mary reported that this year the Annual Fighting Island Regatta was in the black.



Harbour Master (Bob MacKenzie)

- Reported that all the boats were out of the water two days ahead of schedule. Bob congratulated the lift crew and tractor personnel for a job well done.
- Insurance forms are still not up-to-date. Make sure updated insurance forms are given to the harbour master. Boats should not be hooked up to power unattended. If you are working on your boat then hook up during winter is acceptable. No boats should be hooked up overnight or if not attended.

Roads and Grounds (Patrick Holland)

- Patrick thanked Gail Oliver for an excellent job in maintaining the flowers, shrubs during the sailing season.
 - Area around the cradles was cleaned up.
 - Gravel made a difference this year, but puddles still persist. Next year more gravel will be added.
- Volunteers are still need in Roads and Grounds. Patrick suggests that you pick your jobs early before they are all gone.

Race Director (Bob Reaume)

- Ralf Fiedler on Bob's behalf thanked the Wednesday Night Race Committee for an excellent job well done. Many thanks to Connie Buliga and Dennis Douthart for their perseverance during the sailing season. Many thanks also to the Monday Night Race Committee Brian Casey for an excellent sailing season.

Treasurer (Perry Basden)

- The treasurer read out the names of the members who were in arrears and could not vote on any proposals during this meeting unless they were paid up.
- More members were billed this year for work hours than last year.
- Perry brought members up-to-date on the finances for the club.

Ralph Kepran (Commodore)

- Reported that the executives will not be chasing members for monies due. Ralph read and summarized the account as written by him in the November Newsletter regarding invoices and outstanding charges. (See November Newsletter Vice-Commodore's Report.

- Reminded members to make sure all their ladders are locked up. One ladder unlocked will make it easy for a thief to vandalize your boat.

- There is an outboard in the garage. No-one seems to know who owns it.

- No personal storage allowed in the clubhouse or on property.

Ralph reminded members that if they wish to donate something to the club please check with the executives before bringing it. The club might not need it.

The Vice-Commodore (Ralph Kepran) reminded members that Sailing Awards were given out Saturday Evening for outstanding sailing skills. Today he was thanking members who he felt did an excellent job throughout the year.

Manfred Albrecht – For stepping up and constructing a railing on the North Harbour when a club member fell off the dock. This job was accomplished in less than a week.

Jerry Angus (Club Secretary) – Beyond just performing his duties as the club secretary Jerry was also involved in hauling boats and cradles during the week and week ends.

Launch and Haul Out Crews – Many thanks to those members who were involved in this endeavour. All boats were successfully hauled and bedded for the winter in their cradles.

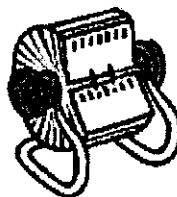
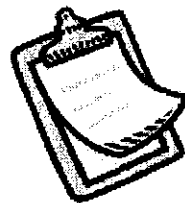
Yvonne McRobbie (Club Member) – Did an excellent job in engraving the trophies for this year's Awards Banquet.

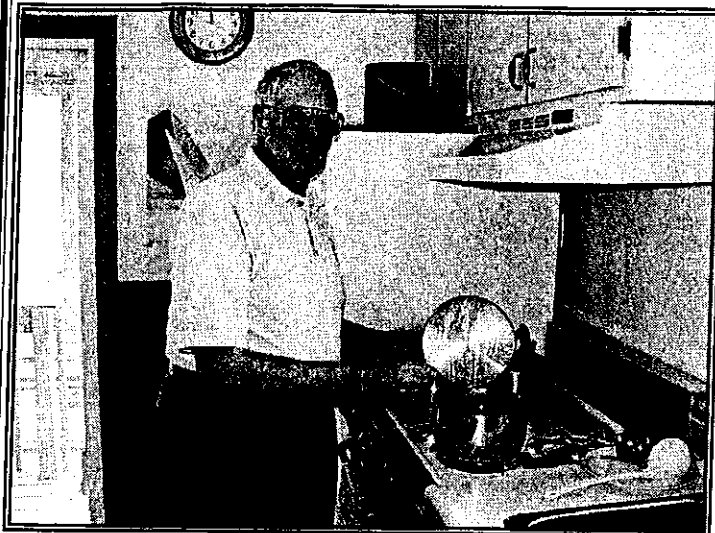
Under New Business Chris Barron Past Commodore read the proposed slate of officers for the 2005 season. There were no nominations from the floor and the proposed slate was accepted.

LMYC Monday Luncheons

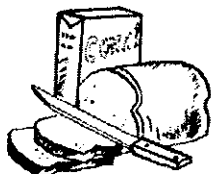

Treasurer's Report

I would like to express my thanks to the Membership for their continued support and for your show of confidence in my ability to act on your behalf as Club Treasurer. I am very proud to be allowed the privilege of serving as Treasurer for another term. I will strive to meet your expectations and to continue to serve the Club with honesty and integrity. I would also like to express my thanks to Past Commodore Ralf Fiedler and to Past Secretary Jerry Angus for all their help over the past year. You both, along with the other Members of the Executive, have been excellent people to work with and certainly helped to make my small portion of the task a lot easier. A warm welcome is extended to the Clubs newest Executive Members, Rick Beresford, Larry Laing and Tom Boyce. I look forward to serving with you for the 2004-2005 term. I'm sure every member will benefit from your service to the Club

My first year as Treasurer was quite a learning experience for me, not only from a bookkeeping point of view, but I have also learned a lot about the Clubs day to day operations as well as getting to know some of the Members on a more personal basis. There is a ton of work being done in operating this organization and I believe that every Member should be given the opportunity and experience that I have gained as a Member of the Executive.

I have received a few inquiries as to how and when the Service Charges are added to Member Accounts. The process is fairly simple and follows the Club By Laws but it may not be understood by everyone. I will try to explain it as best I can in this limited space. If anyone has any further questions I would be only too happy to answer them personally or at a Club Meeting.

The invoicing process for boat related charges has been in a state of flux ever since we purchased our own lift. Some variations were tried over the past years but most seemed to require too much effort in trying to determine who has paid before launch or haulout. It should not be up to the lift operators or the Harbour Master to police the payments. They are already putting in lots of extra work hours and certainly don't need the further aggravation of trying to figure out who has paid or not. As a result of our past trials, it was decided in May of 2004 that the Members will be invoiced on specific dates each year

Invoices for Membership are sent out on January 1, Launch and Dockage are sent out on April 1 and Haulout or Winter Storage are sent out on October 1. Boat related charges and their payment are not dependent on when the boat is launched or hauled. Boat owners may launch or haul at their

convenience, when qualified people are available to operate the lift and trailer, and within the structure of the By Laws and Rules and Regulations. Invoices for other charges are sent out as they are incurred by the member and all invoices are payable within 30 days of the billing date without incurring any service charges

O.K. so now you've gotten your invoice which was mailed to you on the first of the month. If your account is not paid within the 30 day period as specified on the invoice, a service charge is added at a rate of 2% per month. The service charges are processed as a separate invoice and mailed with a statement on the first day of the month following your initial billing. I usually check my drop box at the Club three times per week as well as the last day of the month, just in case someone wants to squeak in under the wire. This also helps to ensure that service charges are properly applied.

If the original invoice and charges remain unpaid for an additional 30 days (your invoice has been unpaid for 60 days now) you will receive a Registered Letter with a statement of account and another invoice for further service charges. The letter will indicate that the invoice and your account are past due and that further action will be taken if your account is not PAID IN FULL within the next 30 days. The letter will also stipulate that payment must be made in cash or certified cheque. You are then required to pay the initial invoice and any other charges you may have incurred, even if they are less than 30 days old. The intent here is to have you account paid off completely so we don't have to start the process all over again in the following month..

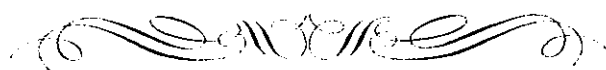
If the invoice, and all subsequent charges are not PAID IN FULL within 30 days of the mailing of the Registered Letter (you have now not paid the original invoice for 90 days), then you will receive another Registered Letter indicating that you are suspended from all Club activities and banned from the Club property until such time as the account is paid in full.

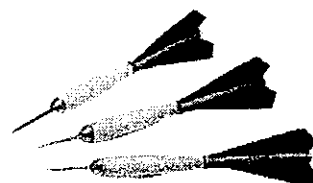

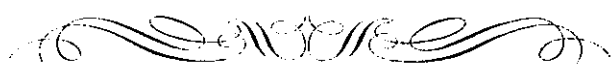

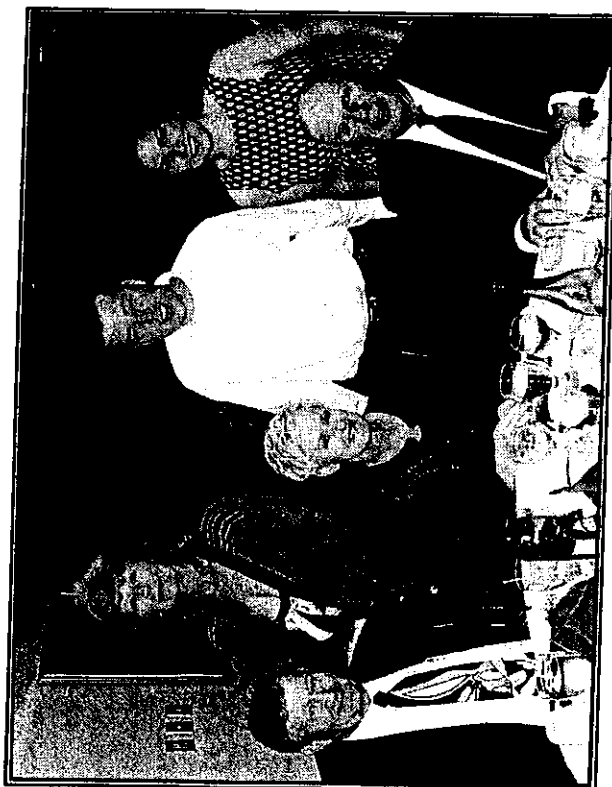

This year 112 members attended the event which all considered a great success.

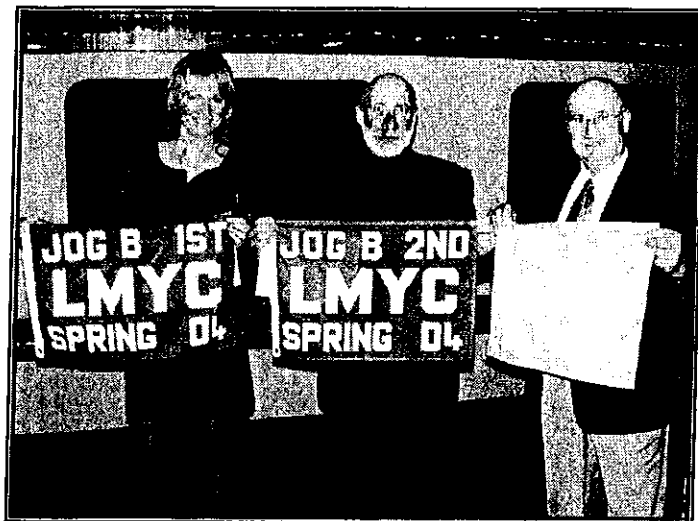
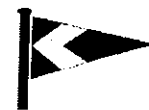
