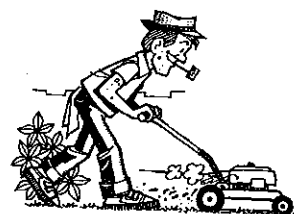
Deepest Sympathies

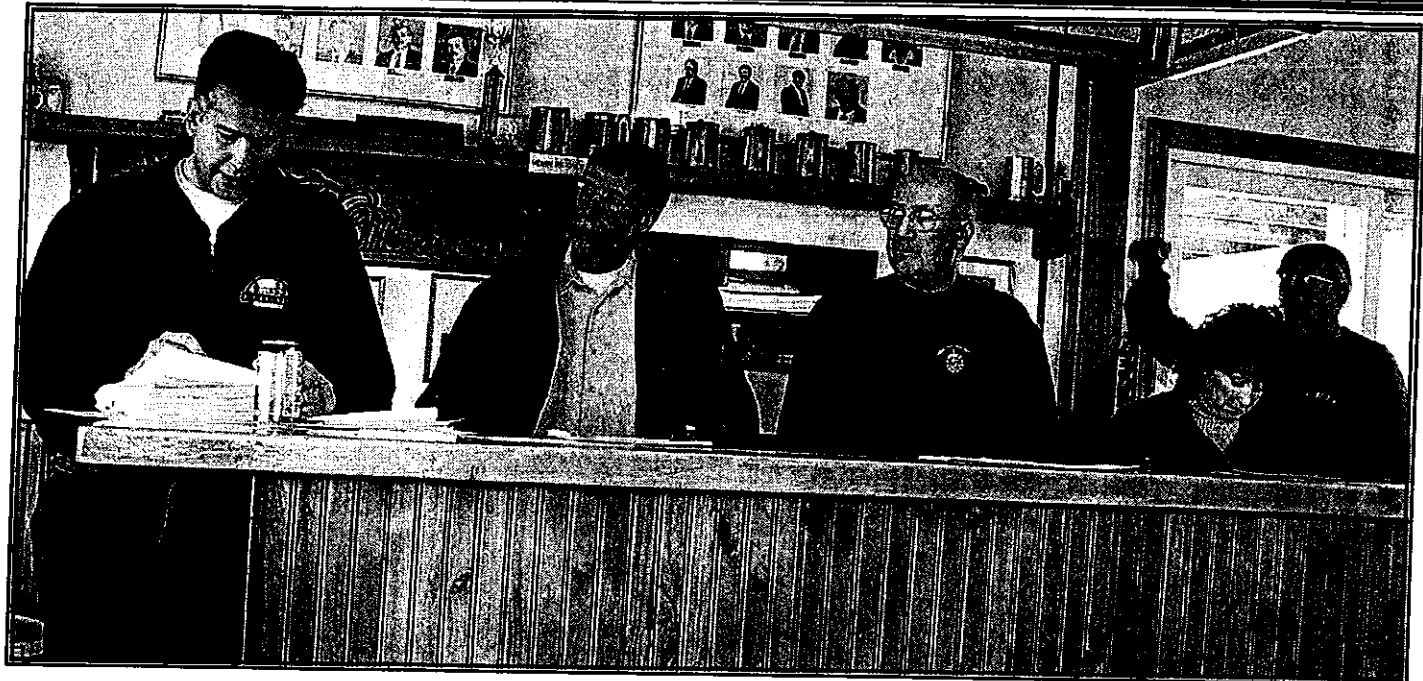

- ◆ Secretary read the minutes from Aug 21st General Meeting.
- ◆ Phil Smith made a motion to accept the minutes as read – 2nd by John Murphy.

Treasurer's report:

- An Accounts Receivable report is available to anyone interested in seeing it.
- The new accounting system with Simply Accounting software is up and running.
- We currently have approx \$1,500.00 dollars left in the 2005 Budget.
- Bank balance is line of credit of \$20,135.90.
- Phil Smith asked if Dick Benny had been billed for his boat dockage at LMYC.
- Dennis Pare stated that a letter and bill had been sent to Dick – payment has not yet been received.
- Dennis moved that his report be accepted as read – 2nd by John Murphy.

Vice Commodore:

- A report was typed up and provided to the Secretary by the Vice Commodore

Highlights

- Of the 69 full members – 26 are automatically credited for their 12 hours due to various jobs including being on the Executive, lift operators, roads and grounds, refreshments etc.
- We also have 7 members who qualify for the 25 years seniority or over the age of 60. That leaves us with 36 members required to record work hours. This year there were 10 members who did not get at least 12 hours recorded. They will be billed at the current rate of \$20.00 / hour.
- The good news is that the great majority of members exceeded their hours and as a result the Club house and roads and grounds are in great shape.
- Rick also mentioned that Bob Bingham was able to borrow a Jensen Lake Mower for us to try out. It was used very successfully to clear the weeds out of our harbor before regatta. Rick recommends we purchase a mower of our own in order

to keep the harbor free of weeds in the future. The cost of a battery operated mower is \$2,755.00 US plus duties. The power box can be purchased at Canadian Tire for approx \$150.00 and is rechargeable.

Rick Beresford made a motion that we purchase a Jenson Lake Mower and Eliminator Power Box.

- Perry Basden mentioned that we may be able to do the same thing but save some money by purchasing a weed cutter that will adapt to our gas operated Weed whacker.
- It was agreed the executive will look into other options.
- Jim Beaudoin made a motion to put money in the 2006 Budget to purchase a Lake mower. The type purchased will be at the discretion of the executive.
- John Vandereerden. seconded the motion.

Rick Beresford motioned that his report be accepted as read – 2nd by John Murphy.

House Director:

- Tom is purchasing a 4 drawer filing cabinet for the club to store documents in.

Social Director:

- Mary commented that it was a great party last night at Place Concorde.
- There were 120 people in attendance.
- The Bob and George show was very good.
- There were some concerns about the hall and Mary is looking for some feedback on this subject.
- Mary mentioned she is going to look at the Verdi club.
- Mary Ellen Mangile. suggested maybe looking at Fox Glen again
- Another suggestion was the Greek club.
- John Murphy suggested Fox Glen was nice because it is small enough to keep everyone close.
- Rich Parchoma. suggested looking for a place where the stage can be seen by everyone.
- Bob Reaume suggested looking at the River Canard K of C.
- The tree trimming party is coming up – confirm date with Mary – Mary Nantais is looking for feedback on whether or not to have the Party on Friday of Saturday night. She cannot run it if it is on Saturday night.
- The Kids party will be on the Sunday.
- Mary needs a volunteer to run the New Years Party.

Harbor Master:

- 56 boats were hauled out between Oct 1st and Nov 12th. The hauling was done 3 days early- all markers were also brought in.
- Bob mentioned that we will have a full harbor next year.

Roads and Grounds:

- George thanked Mike Puchnatyj and crew that took over doing the grounds – everything looks very good.
- Tim McWilliams asked that people wash the dirt left on the lift after people pressure spray their boats while in the slings.
- George is not doing Roads and Grounds next year.

Commodores Report:

- John Metcalfe thanked the current executive for all their hard work.
- John mentioned the Power washer has been sent out for repairs.
- The service man says some seals are burnt up and this is due to starting the motor without water running to the pump and it also can be caused by the unit running for a long period of time without the trigger being pulled. The cost of the repairs will be approx \$400.00.
- A sign will be made up telling people how to run the unit in a way that it will not damage the seals.

Old Business:

- Lothar asked if anyone could donate a wheel barrow as the clubs unit is still missing.
- John Metcalfe suggested Richard Parchoma put a note about this in the currents. If it is not returned we will have to buy a new one.

New Business:

- John Murphy reported that he collected \$220.00 in donations from racers to help Dennis Douthart out with fuel costs.
- Mary Ellen Mangile presented a Burgee from the Chicago Yacht Club.
- John Metcalfe gave Mary Ellen a LMYC to give to them in return.
- Mary Ellen also received a spare burgee if she finds the need to give one to another club.
- John mentioned that Barb and Manfred Albrecht would like to put on a presentation of their trip to the Caribbean. The date for this is still yet undetermined.
- Bob Reaume asked if there has been any progress with getting the Fighting Island Regatta changed to Saturday for next year.
- This is currently being worked on – Rob Ferguson is getting the Coast Guard approvals.
- Dennis Pare mentioned that the duties of the Treasurer have become very large. Dennis wants to spin off some of the duties.
- Denis suggests we look for an Accounts Receivable manager from the membership.
- This would enable both jobs to be done better and more efficiently.
- Gord Freeman asked if the position would be appointed or elected – the position would be an appointed position.
- John Vandereerden mentioned that we probably did not need a motion for this – the person can just be appointed by the Executive.
- This position will be filled in the near future.
- Shirley Beresford (on behalf of the Sea Cadets) thanked the LMYC membership for use of the club.
- John Metcalfe thanked her for the opportunity to promote the sport of sailing to the Cadets.

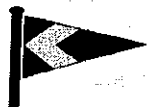

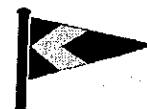


- John Metcalfe asked if there were any nominations from the floor – there were none.

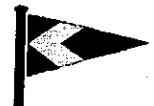

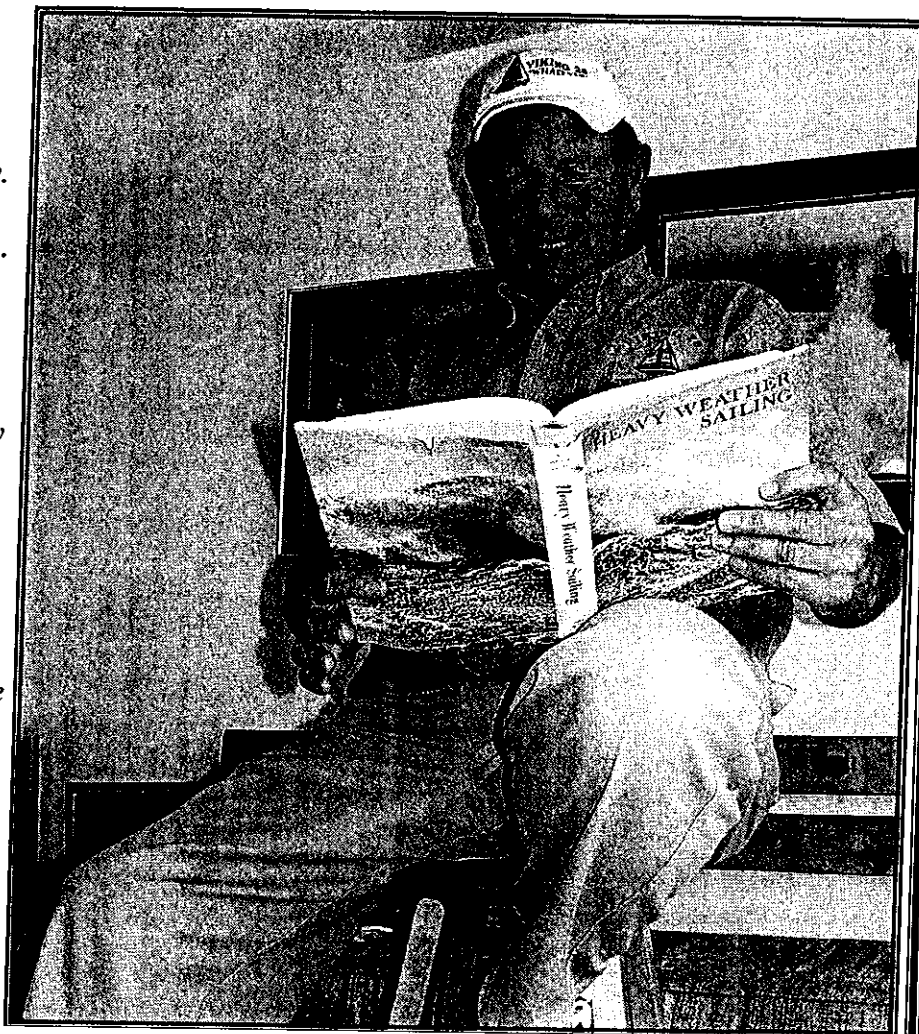


Stories by George

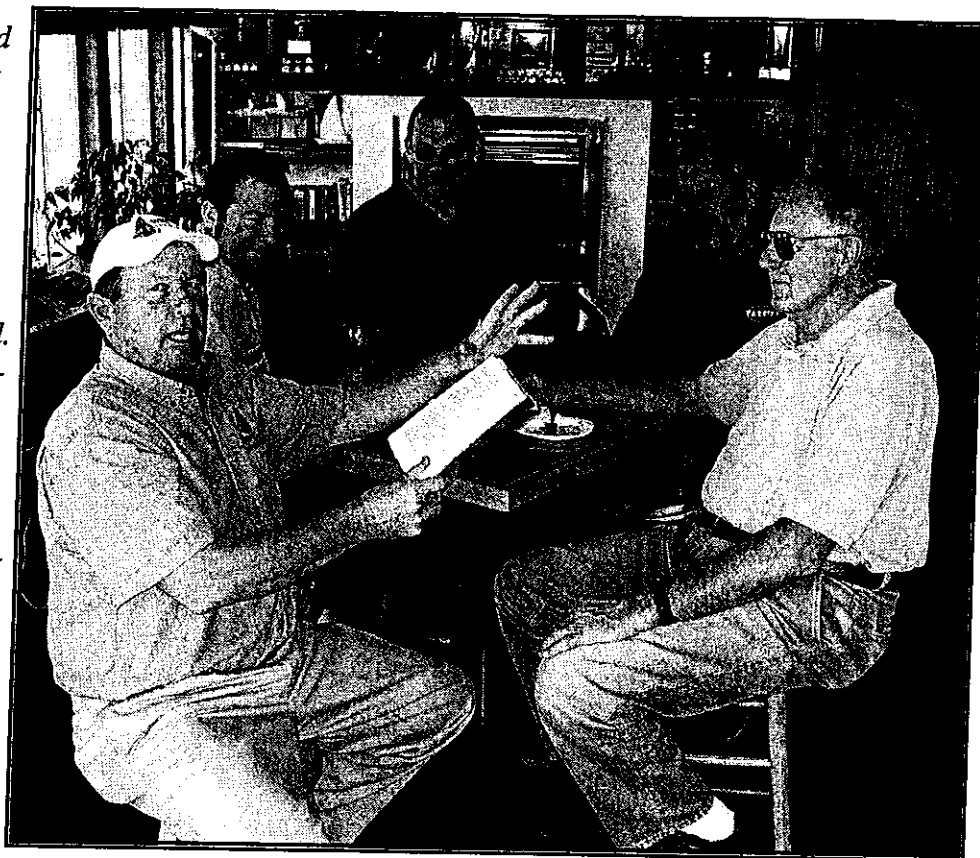

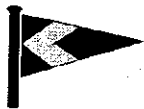

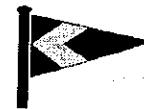
The Grand Finale at the Awards Banquet when "Maximus Dickus" comes in with the 15 Commandments.
