

Ever wonder where the phrase "shake a leg" came from? Well in days of old, crews on British warships were often denied






Try to integrate regular physical activity into your daily routines, such as shopping, gardening, and social outings.

You don't have to take part in a demanding or strenuous exercise routine to enjoy being physically active. Do the things you like to do. Be active everyday. These are the best of times!




