To Bob Williams: Get Well Soon and get back to our Monday lunches. The Table of Knowledge needs your input.



Darts at LMYC, according to old LMYC newsletters began in 1978. When the game was first played at the



The tradition of Wednesday Night Darts, 28 years later still continues.









NEW BOATING RULES IN MICHIGAN

According to one of the Detroit papers Michigan boaters will be paying more for boat registration in 1975. Apparently a new law covers a three year period and the owners have to pay three times the annual rate this year, two times next year and the third year the annual rate. Sounds complicated and good luck to their bureaucracy.

Typical rates for sailboats (classified as motorboats if they have inboard or outboard power) for 1975 would be: 16' to 20' \$22.50; 20" to 28" \$60.00; 28" to 35" \$90.00; 35' to 42' \$120.00.

The registration fee revenue used for marine purposes. Twenty-vive percent goes to launch ramp and harbour construction and 75% goes to the Marine Safety Fund.

This column will reprint items from the Club rules and constitution which sometimes get forgotten. It makes for interesting reading and discussion. The first item is from the Club rules governing the Clubhouse.

- 1. No excessive noise after midnight during the boating season.
- 2. Any damage done by members or their guests will be repaired or replaced by those responsible.
- 3. All guests must be accompanied by members.
- 4. Keys to the Clubhouse doors will not be loaned to non members
- 5. All members are responsible for securing the Clubhouse after use.
- 6. The Clubhouse will be cleaned by 2 male members each week according to the posted schedule. This does not mean cleanup after parties as those who attend said parties are responsible for the Clubhouse appearance.
- 7. Spirited activity in the Clubhouse is probibited.
- 8. No children are allowed in the Clubhouse without parental supervision.
- 9. No pets are allowed in the clubhouse.
