






he LMYC Tree Trimming Party was held on Saturday December 11, 2004 with many friends and members in attendance.


This was an evening set-aside for members to start the season by giving from your heart.

This year the event was coordinated by Social Director Mary Nantais and her husband Dave.


The tree trimming tradition was started at LMYC many years ago and consists of bringing out the Christmas Tree and decorating it with lights, bulbs and colorful beads.





his year LMYC on December 20, 2004 celebrated its traditional Turkey Dinner luncheon this year prepared by Bob Bingham.





WORK HOURS AT LMYC

By-Law Number 1. Article 3. (c) "A full Member is required to work a minimum of 12 hours work per year starting at haul out and ending the day before following haulout. Hours worked by one Member cannot be credited to another Member. Hours worked by a Member's family count towards that Member's 12 hours. Work hour cards must be deposited in order to receive credit."

Our club's founding members in their great wisdom decided to enact this **Work Hours Article** so that all full members will equally share the work load to maintain the club.

Our members are quite capable of performing most jobs around the club so that only a few tasks and major projects need to be hired out. As a result our Membership Dues are probably amongst the lowest of the Yacht Clubs in the Great Lakes Region. At LaSalle Mariners we have also found that sharing the work involved in maintaining an active sail club instills pride of ownership and helps to bind the membership together. Each year most members far exceed their required12 hours. However, there are at times members who are unable to perform their hours and in such cases the club's By-Laws provide that they will be charged at the rate set by the Board of Directors (currently \$ 20) for unworked hours.

Work Hours Report

The *Work Hours Report* for 2005 will be updated and posted each month in the Club House and on the outside Notice Board.

The Report will cover the period from Nov. 15 2004 (Haulout) to Nov. 13 2005. The jobs to be performed for Work Hours and the recording of hours actually worked will be controlled by the Vice Commodore.

The Work Hours Report will only show the names of members who are <u>not</u> <u>automatically credited</u> with their work hours.

Special Conditions Affecting Work Hours:

- (1) Some members are **automatically credited** with their hours worked because of the duties or job they are responsible for at the club (for example: Officers and Directors, Currents publishing and distribution, Maintenance, Roads and Grounds, Harbour Master, Keeper of the Lift, Refreshment Control and Procuring, Lift Operators, ILYA Representative, Blessing of the Fleet Chairperson).
- (2) In accordance with Article 12. (g) By-Law Number 1, a member in good standing who reaches the age of 60 and has been a Full member for at least 25 years is not required to record work hours. (Please note, however, that such a long serving member is not exempt from working the required 12 hours, only from recording such hours). Such members are requested to verbally advise the Vice Commodore when they have completed 12 hours.
- (3) In accordance with Article 3. (f) By-Law Number 1 the Executive may exempt a Member from work hours providing the Member's residence is outside a 100 kilometer radius from the club and there is no boat to dock or store.

All members are requested to record their hours on the Work Hours Card as soon as they complete their jobs. Also, continue to enter your hours for any job that takes you beyond your 12 required hours so that the club can have a record of the jobs accomplished for future task planning even though only 12 hours will be recorded on the report.
