




I am confident that we can look to our future with the wisdom of experience and with the confidence of our members that we will be successful in all our endeavours.





Many thanks to Joanne Blackton who did a sensational job with the face painting.







As many of you know we are back in Trinidad since Nov. 1. Our direct flight from Toronto took 5:40 hrs and our Taxi was waiting to take us into Chaguaramas to Power Boats where St. Pauli stood hi and dry for the past 6 months. The heat was too much for us and we were glad to have reserved an air conditioned apartment for the first few days to have a better chance to get accustomed to the climate. On the other hand I still remembered my disappointment from last year as we set foot on board and found the boat completely covered in mildew inside and did not know where to put our luggage down. I wanted to have a good night sleep before setting foot on board

But the first thing in the morning was to walk over to the Immigration to clear back in.

After about a 15 minute walk at 8:00 am we arrived there completely drenched in sweat. it was already close to 30 C. and the sun was very bright. The officers welcomed us back and after about 1 hrs or so we stepped on board with much anticipation. But we were pleasantly surprised to find the inside of the boat only covered in dust. We had left the forward hatch open which was covered by our dinghy and also the porthole in the head was open to have some type of fresh air coming in. I was so happy and started with the cleaning. I guess when your cruising you always learn new ways to make life a little easier. This year we only bought a cheep blue tarp and there was more air flow through the boat and not at all closed in. Although our original tarp was shredded to pieces Pete and Sue from "Laboatique" were so kind to replaced it with their used one in Sept. as they returned from their brief stay in Ohio. Many thanks for that, friends!

It is now 2 weeks after our arrival and every day there is something else for us to do on board. Especially for Manfred . As I'm writhing this letter he is grinding the new water line which had to be brought up even higher yet. The barnacles loved our red paint and it was always a chore to clean. Our Air Marine wind generator is on the blink and we will get a new one called Kiss which is made locally by a Canadian sailor who set up shop for years here. One can see his product on many of the boats around. By the way there are about close to 2000 boats registered with immigration and the bulk of them are still on the hard. It is a jungle of masts all around us.

We have seen many familiar faces by now and it is a kind of a home coming when we meet each other. In a little while I'll will be picked up by a friend and we will walk over to the cyber cafe to send our messages.

We both send our greetings to every one and send our love to our families. Until the next time good bye to all from Mom and Dad, Oma and Opa and Manfred and Barb.

This is my first try at the internet cafe and I hope that it will work, Barb.


