


From the Vice-Commodore



Bob Williams has been a member of LMYC since its inception more than 30 years ago. During his career Bob has been an avid sailor and motorcycle enthusiastic.

Bob began riding bikes at the age of 15 and ran Williams Motorcycle (Williams Honda) for over 25 years.

Bob's other great love is sailing. His first sailboat was a sunfish, then a viking 22 and a 27 foot Stiletto Catamaran.

Some of Bob's exploits in sailing included multi hull races to Mackinaw and served as a

crewman for one month on a 45 foot Bristol in 1981. This boat sailed from West Palm Beach to Martinique.


Bob's latest dream will begin to take shape on August 26-27 of this year. This will be the test run of the Streamliner. The test will take place at Windsor airport on those two days from approximately 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. There will be two test runs on each of those days. The driver of this vehicle lays down and looks out thorugh a periscope. The bike is 25 inches in diameter and is 19 feet long.


This test will be without the Motorcycle's skin and is the first

step before building the body. Bob hops to have the bike ready for Speed Week at the Bonneville Salt Flats in Utah, August 15-22 in 2001. The competition is very rapid and it involves competitors from all over the world.

Bob's first bike in this type of competition was an open bike when ridden. Jeff Williams rode this bike in August 1998 at Bonneville. It is a 350 cc engine (21 cubic inch) turbocharged) and achieved a speed of 156.52 miles per hour. The record Jeff was trying to beat was 156.92 miles per hour.

Good luck Bob in all your endeavours.






Shakedown at LMYC




Shakedown crew before campfire


This year the race to Put-in-Bay or Shakedown was canceled because of low water and dredging at our club and other clubs.
