




## **Congratulations**



## Shakedown 2005

aturday morning I arrived at LaSalle Mariners to participate in the 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Race to Put-in-Bay, Ohio.

This is the first regatta of the season and participation from our club were 9 vessels, all manned with eager crew members to sail across the western basin of Lake Erie.

The starting line just off Bar Point had approximately 30 boats, jockeying for position and with the finishing line located 26 nautical miles near Lonz's Winery on Middle Bass Island.

The morning was bright and sunny at 65 degrees F. accompanied by a light breeze from the East at 2-4 knots.

The starting order began with the J.O.G. fleet at approximately 0900 hours with P.H.R.F. classes to follow.

By the time our fleet heard the gun the decision was to begin with a spinnaker start at the mark and with almost no breeze we delicately floated across the imaginary line with our spinnaker sails hanging like drapes.



We continued on for a couple hours with little headway but kept the faith that the Easterly breeze would pick up sooner than later.

Although some of the boats felt differently, started their motors and went on their way. As the day progressed so did the wind with the majority of the boats sailing along side North Bass Island and to get to the finish line off Lonz's Winery and the Committee Boat.

It was now Saturday evening around dinner time when we arrived to find all the usual docking facilities filled. Miller Boat Line, Crew's Nest, and the town marina known to the locals as the zoo were quickly filling up and rafting of 6 boats deep, while a handful of our racers had to use the mooring balls located in the harbour.

Boats were everywhere along with flags and smiling faces giving cheer to the Victoria Day Holiday and wonderful weather. THE BAY IS ALIVE.

The awards were presented in DeRivera Park at the gazebo by Robbie Ferguson (Race Director). Congratulations goes out to Len Strahl of Lionheart II for Overall and Fastest boat. In the J.O.G. fleet in first place was Thunder & in P.H.R.F. A Slo-Poke. Also Bob Bingham of Special Delivery was awarded Boat of the Year 2004.

It was a wonderful event and congratulations to all crews.

Special Thanks to the Social Director Mary Nantais and Chili Chef Andy Kozieradzki for their hard work in making this day a day not to miss.




