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




### From the Vice-Commodore



Over 80 guest attended this year with Lyse and Pierre LeBlanc from LeBlanc Estate







any members of LMYC at this time of the year are thinking of boating and perhaps repairs to their boats. For this month's issue of The Currents I would like to profile Diamond Boat Works and Clare's Mobile Marine both located on Pillette Road.

### Diamond Boat Works

Started up in the winter of 1997 with the first boat completed being Bob Reaume's gem "Rescape" in a very clear jade color. Sure was nice to a paint job the right way - our way. We were very proud of this

job and we know Bob was too. We completed 6 boats that spring, and our shop was well on its way. A pleasant, easy summer on "Stripes" allowed time to setup lots of work for the

winter of 98 and 99 and we completed "Rugger" an S2.79 from Detroit and it turned out great. If you've read the paper lately it's

very fast.

Then bang, everything stops. That's right, the day after Christmas I fall off a scaffold in the shop. seriously hurting my foot. Two and half months later and still limping today. This was a very hard time for us but it was amazing to see the people come out of the woodwork to help: Marj, Jurgen, Ian, Curtis, Gooch, Donny and Ray, just to name a few. With some understanding customers we finished 9 boats that spring. Another strong summer and we are booked solid for 99 and 20000.


Some projects of note: Bob Reaume is back for a bottom job, Brian Case's Niagara 26 is set for a new deck paint. We have recently finished Brian Labute's C&C 30 and "Bravo" a C& C 35 from Detroit.

The shop has grown and double in size and with the addition of "Clare's Mobile Marine" to share some shop time. Continuity has come to our shop, making us one of the best

repair shops in the Great Lakes attracting boats from Detroit, Toronto, Toledo Windsor, North Caroline and Florida. We prefer to work on boats 30 feet and under but we're not afraid of the big stuff either. In the fall of 98 we painted Bill Martin's SC-70 "Stripes" and the summer of 98 the bottom of Dutch Schmidt's Maxi boat "Sassy"


