## From The Commdore & Vice Commodore








Congratulations to Dave and Mary Nantais on the purchase of their new sailboat, a 31 foot Hunter. Great sailing ahead.

This year the LMYC is proud to annouce that it raised \$5350.00 for Hospice. This final figure will increase when the sale of T-shirts and food sales are taken into account.













Amigo 1V - Race Committe Boat





## Racing at the Summer Olympics

forgot to mention that on Sunday I was drug tested. We came in from racing and I was met at the dock by a doping control official. He informed me I was to be tested and then he followed me around until I was ready to go to the doping control building. I was given water to drink to make sure I could go within one hour of docking. We walked into the office where I was met by four other officials. I then sat down and chatted and drank until I was ready to perform. I was then led into a bathroom at the back of the office.

Giving a urine sample for drug testing is not the most comfortable thing to do. Everything is done in front of an official. First you roll up your shirt to your chest. Then you drop your pants to the floor. You then have to pee into a cup until there is an adequate sample; set the cup down and put a lid on it. Get dressed, wash your hands and take the sample into the next room. Sit down at the table in front of two officials. You then open up a sealed package containing two glass containers. You pour half of the sample into each container. The containers are then sealed shut and the official takes a small sample of the remaining amount and tests it to make sure it is not too diluted or too strong. If that test passes then your

Race number three should have been our best race yet. We had another good start and rounded the weather mark in the top three. We lost one boat downwind and one boat upwind but we gained that boat back on the next downwind. When we rounded the leeward mark we were outside boat but that was okay because we were being headed as wee sailed away from the mark. Suddenly the wind switched back to the left and immediately the boats that rounded behind us were now in front. At the weather mark we were now in tenth position. On the next downwind we were able to pass New Zealand right at the finish.

Race number four was a bad one. We were over early at the start and had to restart. With this tight a fleet it is almost impossible to get back into a race and this proved true as we rounded the first mark in fifteenth position. We managed throughout the race to gain two more boats and ended up thirteenth.

We are now sitting tied for eleventh. We have to have a good day today to make it into the next round. To give you an idea about how tight the racing is behind us is the 1996 gold medallist and 2000 World match racing champion Jesper Banks. Our training partner, Norway is leading the regatta. After the first two days four time Olympic medallist Jochen Schumann from Germany joking asked for tranquilizers to help with the stress of sailing in such shifty conditions.

After sailing we went over to CYC (a yacht club beside the venue) to enjoy a snack before heading back on the ferry. We can meet our wives and families here - they are not allowed at the sailing site. As we were eating TV star Sarah Jessica Parker sat down at the table beside us. Being good Canadians we gave her and her friends Canadian Olympic Team pins to wear. The night before

Tom Cruise had visited CYC but we were not there to witness. He supposedly owns a house right behind the sailing venue. The only place to watch the sailing outside the harbour is from one of the heads. These are high cliffs that border the entrance to Sydney Harbour. April and the Boston gang daily take the ferry to Manley and then walk up to the top of the north head to watch us sail.


