


From the Harbor Master



LMYC Single Handed Race was held Sunday August 12th with the start at 9:50 AM. The race started with overcast skies, which was replaced with a warm sunny day. While racers were eating, chatting with friends and racers they were entertained this year by Frank's D.J. Services.


This year the awards were presented by Race Director Don Beneteau and Regatta chairman Alan Prettyman.


After the awards many racers decided to leave early because of the persistent rain. Many members and racers continued to eat, drink, chat and enjoy the rest of the day.



















