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
From the Commodore and Vice-Commodore



Here is a Solution!



I tried this at the club with club members and it DID NOT WORK FOR ME. Maybe it will work for you.



I am presently in Rogers City, Michigan. My trip has been great so far. I have not be going terribly fast, but am pretty much on track. I am meeting lots of people...most are amazed at what I am doing. I have decided that when people say that I am "adventurous"...they really mean I am "crazy". (laughing here)...so that is my new definition for adventurous. I have been fortunate that most of my problems have been small and manageable. It was a stroke of luck for me that John Murphy and Kathy met me out on Lake St. Clair and having just had my main halyard "sky"...John gave me the advice to just continue on and not stop at City Marina to have it brought down. That was important advice for me at that moment. I really needed to just keep going and not stop short of my first day goal. I went to the Ecarte Channel in the St. Clair River that day. My "word of the day" for my first day was "strength"...thanks Lindy...i t was certainly appropriate. In the morning a couple of workers at the marina brought my halyard down. They said they "just couldn't let me leave without being able to sail on such a beautiful day". I was planning to bring it down at Port Huron Yacht Club where I ended up spending a couple of days. It was so much fun that day...Judge followed me down the river (by car of course) and we went to dinner when I got to the Yacht Club. "What a guy"!!! He has been visiting me on the

weekends. I feel like a school girl and he is my boyfriend. What a fun time we have had!!!

Having successfully made it to the deeper water I left Presque Isle with lots of great memories. One of which was a fellow sailor who left Harrisville behind me and sailed to Presque Isle, as well. It was amazing...he came over in the morning and complimented me on my seamanship. Wow...that did wonders for my self confidence as you could imagine. I was boarded also by a Customs Officer that day, too.

It was a wonderful sail to Rogers City. Only about 18 miles...but I got to sail the whole way. Well...that brings you totally up to date with my trip ... as I sit at the computer in the library at Rogers City. I am off to do some shopping and haven't decided whether I will sail to Hammond Bay and anchor.. or just stay here and head to Bois Blanc (Bob-Lo) Island tomorrow. It is across from Cheboygan. After that I will be heading to St. Ignace and will spend a couple of days there. I will try to send an update every once in a while. Well...that should do it...Hiiiiiiiii to everyone and thanks for all the help and support you have given and shown me.



ur crew on 'Yes' for the Race included John Amyot, Nick Lintunen, Mark Stein from Thames River and Dave Nantais. Dave and Mary took their own boat for vacation to the Bay and were great support for us.

We were ready for the Deep Water race to the Bay on Sunday. We departed LMYC at 7:30 am and while performing a reverse to remove the weeds, we sheered the pin on the prop. We then sailed back to the canal, pushed the boat to the hoist, lifted it up and thanks to help from Alan Prettyman and Judge Mangile managed to fix the problem - what a start to a great adventure. Good thing we have this lift and great club members that like to help one another!!!

Knowing we would now miss the deep water race we gathered for a good breakfast. We left the club around 10:30 and there was no wind. Motoring

across the lake, we caught the racers by Middle Sister Island at about 2:30 pm. These sailors were challenged by very light winds.

Feisty was doing well....as was GUS and Hellion.

I am not sure about Special Delivery, from my perspective it looked like the crew had a better idea for the race, we could see them swimming behind the boat, I am not sure if pushing the boat is legal!!!!! (Special Delivery was not entered in the Deep Water Regatta) It was 7:30 by the time the first boats finished this race. Feisty was first.

Monday was the first day of Bay Week races -2 races back to back windward leeward. We had 6 Abbots in the fleet, Fiesty, Special Delivery, Kaleidoscope, I Love You Baby! Zephyr Hawk and "Yes"

Bay Week races are very well organized, 2 large race committee boats, marks set perfectly to windward with great race instructions. I regret that this was only the second time for me at Bay Week. They really do a great job!

First race of the day we started in the middle of the line sailing fast. The first leg was very shifty and we fell behind. At the first mark, we were in the back of the fleet. (Special Delivery had a very good race) The crew settled in for an important downwind leg. We sailed quickly and jibed often to clear our air. Feisty got away and sailed in clear air straight to the mark. We had caught two of our competitors and began the second upwind leg. We were fortunate to be on the right side of some shifts and rounded the upwind mark in second place. Most stayed the same for the remainder of the race. Good job to Special Delivery who placed third. They did a great job holding off a fast Zephyr Hawk at the finish.

The Second Race went better for us, we managed to sail better upwind rounding up front and never gave away the lead, Hawk was second and Feisty third. Biggest lesson for me: is to watch the wind direction as it pays to watch shifts, and stay in clear air.

There was small celebration afterwards, we were in first place after the first day, Even as a skipper I do not have much to do, but I was very tired after this day just listening to all the "advice" from the other FOUR skippers on the boat. It was exhausting, but worked well as the results show.

I attribute our performance to great crew.

Monday night is all for celebrations, Abbots party at 4 pm then Bacardi Rum party at 6 pm in the pavilion.

I was appointed as a volunteer to organize the A33 winter meeting and we had a few ideas right away, like going skiing to Collingwood or renting a bus for a trip to Chicago Boat show.

Rum Party lasted very late..... and was a great success!

We also had some cruisers visiting the Bay - perhaps just for the party???? George with his Viking and crew and Bob Reaume with his A33 enjoyed the great weather. Oddly - we worked all day in the hot sun and then got to drink rum. I think Mr. Mooney and Mr. Reaume had a different tack....as they seemed to have saved their energy for the party... and it showed as they were in the lead at the pavilion!!!

On another note.... I am not sure why a couple of pictures I had taken turned out so fuzzy? Who was moving George or the camera????

Back to the races.....Tuesday was time for a long distance race. After a quiet night, we did not expect much wind. We were blessed with 5-10 knots all day and very good sailing weather. It was a sunny day, but not quite as hot as Monday. It was about a 16 mile course that took us us counterclockwise around the islands. The race started upwind followed by downwind under spinnaker and a headsail reach to Ballast Island. From Ballast, we sailed upwind to the finish at the freighter on the island.

We rounded the first windward mark in 5th place with Feisty, Kaleidoscope and Hawk way ahead. We had a bad start that resulted in "dirty air" throughout the first leg. Once again, we went to work downwind. Jibe after jibe...heading to shore and playing all the puffs we recovered and found ourselves in first at the leeward mark.

On the headsail reach, we extended our lead over Feisty, but the Hawk got much closer. We believe Feisty may have caught some weeds.

Rounding the Ballast Island is a great skill, there is no mark to round, if You go close to shore -there is no wind. If you go wide....well it adds distance to your course. Being in the lead, we chose to play it safe and sail around the island's wind shadow. Feisty on the other hand, cut the corner and it paid off big time! They cut a 90second lead to almost none. Hawk also cut the corner and got into the lead....As the saying goes..."It is not over until it is over" The three yachts continued on the final upwind leg in fierce tacking battles. The lead changed multiple times on this upwind leg. We focused our efforts on covering Feisty as she was the closest boat in the scoring. This

allowed a very fast Hawk to sail in clear air straight to the finish. About 200 Yards from the finish Feisty lee bowed us and it looked like all was finished. However, we tacked off only to meet again in three minutes. This time, we were fortunate enough to sneak through Feisty to leeward and score a second at the finish a boat length ahead of Feisty and few behind the Hawk.

So we managed to increase our lead after 2 days to 2 points over Feisty and the Hawk. Yes did not race on Wednesday. The yacht sailed back to be with our close friends Adam, Will and Alan during a very difficult time.

The rest.... "Stays at the bay".



ayview Yacht Club held its 2nd annual Women's Invitational Sailing Regatta on Sunday August 14, 2005. There were 17 boats registered for the race with approximately 85 women involved in competing with ages ranging from a young 56 to a 12 year old.

It was noted that one man was allowed onboard for "Catastrophic Avoidance", and safety purposes only. I noticed that about half of the boats on the lake had men aboard. We had Tim LaButte onboard alias McGiver.

The race took place in Lake St. Clair where they set up markers showing 2 windward and leeward course.







Mary Ellen Mangile Leaving LMYC


