

### A REMINDER for FALL HAUL-OUT!!!

Check your cradle for any needed repairs- Pads, Bunk-boards, Uprights Bolts etc.



Make sure the 6/8" Blocks of wood are attached to the bottom frame of the cradle, this will allow the Hyd. trailer to Pick Up the Cradle. Please bring 1 or 2 of your crew to help with Cradle moving.

Call the Harbour Master to arrange for a Lift Crew to haul and Park your boat.

For those needing to complete their work hours

— Bring out your weed cutter to the Cradle

Storage Area to cut the weeds and small trees in and around the Cradles. This will allow the lift crew to move your cradle without any problems.
