Budget for 2011 – Presented by Treasurer Shelia Rowland

Copies provided to the membership in order to follow along with questions that came up

Dredging – Question - do we need \$30,000 – Answer – there has been quote in the past which was in the area of \$17,000 for a small area on the South harbor – we are looking @ building up the shore line to prevent erosion into our canal as well as other work.

<u>Social Events</u> -Question \$12,290 – wouldn't revenue cover majority of cost? There looked to be a need to increase the budget due to some new events as well as low attendance that was unforeseen and was unable to offset fixed cost with revenue. Despite the increase in the budget there will be more scrutiny when planning events to assure cost is kept to a minimum.

<u>House</u> – Repairs & Maintenance increase \$8,400.00 - Few projects such as Kitchen area cabinets as well as \$5,000 for a shelter for the Fork lift tractor on the back end of the existing garage.

<u>Capital Expense Account</u> – not reflecting the correct amount or in proper manner. Sheila understands and will investigate and correct.

<u>Tractor Shelter</u> – suggestion to look into a possible opportunity to have a structure built @ no cost to the club. Solar panels are fixed to the flat roof and the energy is sold. Gus Martin will supply more information

Property Taxes 25% increase – this is due to being re-evaluated by a satellite picture of our property

<u>Raising Dues</u> - With the increase in the Budget – No - Dredging which is the biggest cost needs to be there but there are different scenarios that may take place as well as grants to help limit the cost.

Looking for other quotes for Dredging – sensitive issue and could have backlashes. Need to aware of this before. There could be benefits using Hotie due ability to work with ERCA

Motion to Accept Budget as presented – Gus Martin 2nd Bob Clark – Majority in favor – passed **New Business**


- Dan Denome has opened a new business inside Happy Days Boat Center. Will supply sailing gear.

Crystal Bay Days!

It seems most local landlubbers and sailors alike have heard of Crystal bay. Images from the serene crystal clear waters with blue herons sitting on the limestone shoreline to loud offshore boats clad with gold chains and deck fluff blaring music come to mind too many who have experienced the "Bay".

The water is crystal clear due to the current going through the limestone rocks. These rocks act as a natural brita filter thus filtering the water. It is the most popular destination within the Detroit River for all boaters in the local area. Well it was up until 911 (Sept 11th, 2011). The falling of the twin towers and the resulting increased border regulations discouraged a lot of Americans going to Crystal Bay. This is due to the fact that all American vessel and their anchors planning to touch Canadian land whether it is above or below water us first report to a designated landing (Duffys) to call in and report in with the Canadian Customs. This and increased fuel prices have dropped the number of boats in Crystal Bay heaps!

As a child growing up on my Dad's shark we spent many of weekends at the Bay. My many memories of Crystal Bay consisted of getting food from the two aluminum "Burger Boats" clad with girls wearing cut off jeans from Duffs marina or the "Domino Pizza" boat. Zodiacs zipping around throwing water balloons and splashing each other with buckets of water. Feeding fish chips. A lot of times I remember both my sister and I freaking out while all this was happening since this chaos was happening right over where my Dad was snorkelling.

Well times have changed. Instead of close to 1000 boats in the 80s that would be there on the weekend. You may get about 50 now. The burger boats are gone and even on a weekend you can swim without the worry of some drunk running you over with their zodiac. And on weekdays most of the times you may be the only one in the bay which will allow you to see the Deer, Coyotes and even pair of Bald Eagles that call the bay its home.

The "Bay" that most go into is actually not crystal bay. It is actually Big Bay. Crystal Bay was the name of a smaller bay that is towards the northwest of Big Bay. When the Islands (Dykes) were completed by the Corp of Engineers in the 40's. Big Bay where most of us go now was too weedy to swim in so most people would go back to a small weedless bay with crystal clear water in which they named Crystal Bay. Some of you may know this bay where the rope swing was before the American Sheriffs cut it down due to a serious injury. Just south of the original Crystal Bay is "Skiers Bay" in which is mostly used by wake boarders and water skiers. Just south of that bay is a hill called Spider Mountain in which you can take a dinghy to and climb and have a good perspective on the lower Detroit River.

Towards the middle of the eastern shore close to where most of us anchor in Big Bay is Hidden Lake. This is by far the best place to snorkel. As you work your way through the entrance of Hidden Lake the depth is about 4 ft and you can see many round gobies (invasive species). Once you round the bend it drops off to 20 ft and if you proceeded all the way to the northern end of Hidden Lake. You will find a diving bell. This diving bell is 15ft tall and shaped like a Coke can with a diameter of 8 ft with four portholes towards the top. It was designed like all diving Bells to hold Air that would be put down there by divers so you can snorkel down and then come up in breathable air and sit and look out the portholes underwater. Unfortunately today a couple of the port holes are busted so it does not hold any air anymore.

Well whether you like nature watching or people watching Crystal Bay is the place to go. As long as you dare to go in the bay. My dad taught me the best way to get in is stay about 25ft away from the eastern shoreline except at the entrance of the bay in which you have to give room since there is an underwater peninsula there.

Random Memories of Crystal Bay

- Labour day weekends you would see rafts of up to 18 boats close to where "Eagle 1" a huge yacht would bring a barge and have bands play on.
- A 30 ft Searay leaving Crystal Bay drives itself right up on a Livingston channel dyke.
- A 25 ft Bayliner sinks in front of our house from hitting a buoy. The captain after we helped plucked him from river of empty beer cans claimed he hit a log but after a crane lifted it exposed a green streak along the hull to a 6 ft gash in the fibreglass.
- Drunk guy climbing a tall tree along the shoreline to jump into deep water fell from the top branch down 25 ft and his body bounced off the rocks. He claimed he was fine.
- Multiple zodiacs and jet skis hitting rocks on the shallows to get into skiers bay
- A 40ft commercial vessel parked along the shoreline running a restaurant. (Only last 1 year)
