

Saturday October 4 and Sunday October 5, 2025 Hosted by LMYC and Force 5 Fleet 115

1 RULES

- 1.1 This event is governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028.
- 1.2 The Force 5 Class Association Rules, found at force5class.org apply to all Force 5 races.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The Sailing instructions will be made available by Saturday October 4, 2025.
- 2.2 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official Notice Board inside the LaSalle Mariners Yacht Club (LMYC) clubhouse.

3 COMMUNICATION

3.1 The online notice board is located at **noticeofrace.net**. All NOR, SI, Concussion and registration information can be found there. There may also be a communication board inside the clubhouse at LMYC.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- **4.1** This event is open to all Force 5 Class dinghies and other small sailing dinghies.
- **4.2** Any class of dinghy with 5 or more boats will receive their own start.

- **4.3** A handicap system will apply to all boats without their own start.
- 4.4 Classes will be defined as follows:
- **4.5** Eligible Boats may enter by completing the entry form and submitting it together with the required fee at registration or by emailing the registration form to lmvcracing@gmail.com
- **4.6** Boats may also enter the event by registering online at **noticeofrace.net**.
- 4.7 Pre-Registration is encouraged.

5 FEES

- **5.1** Entry fees are as follows: \$40.00 per person which includes Breakfast and Dinner Saturday, Breakfast and BBQ after racing Sunday.
 - Additional meals for non-racers will be available for a nominal fee. See schedule below. Additional meals must be booked before Friday October 3 to ensure we have enough food available for you.
- **5.2** Fees may be paid by cheque to LaSalle Mariners Yacht Club, via e-transfer to lmyctreasurer@gmail.com or in cash at registration.

6 SCHEDULE

- **6.1** In person registration will be on Friday October 3, 2025 between 5pm-7pm and 9AM-10AM Saturday October 4.
- **6.2** Skippers meeting will be at 11:00AM, Saturday October 4.
- **6.3** Schedule of races will be determined based on the number of registrants and classes registered.
- **6.4** The scheduled time of the first warning signal of the first race is 11:55AM
- **6.5** No warning signals will be made after 4:00PM on October 4.
- **6.6** Sunday October 5, 1st Warning will be at 9:00AM and no races shall be started after 1:00PM. BBQ and awards to follow

7 CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

- **7.1** Due to the strength of the current in the river, it is required that all skippers and crew wear an approved PFD while on the water.
- **7.2** All boats must have a tow line of a minimum of 15 feet attached to the bow of their boat, or a tow line of a minimum of 20 feet attached to the mast of their boat.

8 VENUE

8.1 All boats shall be launched from the dinghy docks at LaSalle Mariners Yacht Club, 2640 Front Road, LaSalle, Ontario.

9 COURSES

- **9.1** The courses to be sailed will be on the Detroit River between the LaSalle Shore line and Fighting Island, around the Grassy Island and Turkey Island area.
- **9.2** Course Sheets will be available at registration time on the day of the event with the sailing instructions
- 9.3 There is a long distance race scheduled around one of the islands, based on conditions.

10 PENALTY SYSTEM

10.1 For all classes, all parts of RRS Rule 44, Penalties at the time of an Incident, will apply.

11 SCORING

- **11.1** Scoring will be done in accordance with RRS Appendix A.
- **11.2** One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- **11.3** When fewer than 5 races are completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores.
- **11.4** When 5 or more races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her (1) worst score.

12 RISK STATEMENT

12.1 RRS 3 states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone". By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury and death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.**

13 PRIZES

13.1 Each first place winner's name will be included on the Detroit River Dinghy Regatta plaque that resides in the LMYC clubhouse.
